Okemah was a historically African American community in southeast Phoenix between 32<sup>nd</sup> Street to 48<sup>th</sup> Street, and the Salt River to Broadway Road. Descendants of the families who lived in this area have the opportunity to apply for Okemah Foundation's 2024 \$2,000 scholarship.

Thank you for your assistance in the distribution of these applications. Please collect and hold the applications, which will be picked up by a representative of the Okemah Community Historical Foundation Scholarship Committee following the March 20, 2024 deadline.

To be eligible for the scholarship the student applicant must:

1. Be a descendant of an Okemah Community resident.
2. Have a GPA of 2.5 or higher and have a need for financial assistance.
3. Be a graduating high school junior or senior who is planning to attend college.
4. Complete an application and submit it by the March 20, 2024 deadline.
5. The application must be accompanied by an unofficial high school transcript, a letter of recommendation, and a personal statement.

The \$2,000 scholarship may be used for books, course-related software, and any other educational expenses.
