Okemah was a historically African American community in southeast Phoenix between 32<sup>nd</sup> Street to 48<sup>th</sup> Street, and the Salt River to Broadway Road. Descendants of the families who lived in this area have the opportunity to apply for Okemah Foundation's 2024 \$2,000 scholarship.

Thank you for your assistance in the distribution of these applications. Please collect and hold the applications, which will be picked up by a representative of the Okemah Community Historical Foundation Scholarship Committee following the March 20, 2024 deadline.

To be eligible for the scholarship the student applicant must:

- 1. Be a descendant of an Okemah Community resident.
- 2. Have a GPA of 2.5 or higher and have a need for financial assistance.
- 3. Be a graduating high school junior or senior who is planning to attend college.
- 4. Complete an application and submit it by the March 20, 2024 deadline.
- 5. The application must be accompanied by an unofficial high school transcript, a letter of recommendation, and a personal statement.

The \$2,000 scholarship may be used for books, course-related software, and any other educational expenses.
